HISTORIC PRESERVATION REHABILITATION TAX CREDITS

If you are planning major renovations to your home or rental property, your project may be eligible for North Carolina Historic Preservation Rehabilitation Tax Credits. For non-income producing properties (such as a private home), you can receive up to 15% percent of your costs back in tax refunds. For income-producing properties (such as rental property or businesses), the refund can be up to 20%.

To qualify, your property must be listed on the National Register of Historic Places and your rehabilitation must conform to the Secretary of the Interior's standards for historic preservation. Tax credits can apply both to exterior repairs and interior work such as kitchen and bath renovations. Most of the residential buildings in Dunleath are already listed on the National Register; you can find out if yours is by calling Mike Cowhig in the City's Historic Preservation program at 336-373-2755.

For more information about applying for the credits, consult the State Historic Preservation Office. For non-income-producing projects contact Mitch Wilds (mitch.wilds@ncdcr.gov 919-814-6588). For income-producing properties contact Tim Simmons (tim.simmons@ncdcr.gov 919-814-6585). Please note: you should apply for the tax credit program before you begin work! It's very difficult to get after-the-fact tax credits.
