# SUMMIT AVENUE STREETSCAPE UPDATE

On Tuesday, March 16, the Greensboro City Council approved the contract for construction of the Summit Avenue Corridor streetscape project. That means more than \$7 million of investment in our pedestrian-oriented infrastructure, which we started advocating for over 15 years ago, will be under construction this spring.

Old timers will remember that this was a bottom-up effort from the beginning: we had lots of help from planners and city staff, but the roots of the project were from neighborhood folk. We had incredible neighborhood engagement over many years.

It's a huge accomplishment, and unique in the city of Greensboro. It took far too long, but we did it. Hooray for us! Hope we can get together soon to celebrate our accomplishments.

#### Neighborhood Branding

The board is moving forward to refine the preliminary plans for gateway and monument features submitted by Designature, and updated landscaping plans for the Max Thompson bridge and other areas are expected in the next few weeks.

Some black metal fences were installed on the sidewalks leading from the Downtown Greenway to Percy and Chestnut Streets. ADA requires handrails at these locations because of the slope of the sidewalks, but the board is exploring handrail options that would be more in keeping with plans for installing arched gateways at these locations. We are communicating with the city and with the Downtown Greenway staff on these issues.

## COMMUNITY GARDEN FUNDRAISER UPDATE
