SUMMIT AVENUE PROJECT UPDATE

An update from City Staff:

- Crosswalks: CACTX (the asphalt stamper) is done for the season. They will come back in the spring to stamp and paint the walks as per the design. The final 8" thermo white lines will then be installed outside of the stamped, painted area. This will be after March 15 at the earliest, depending upon the weather.
- Decorative Lighting: We are still waiting for GDOT to schedule the installation of decorative lighting on Summit and Yanceyville.
- Consolidation of overhead utility lines: There are areas that the utility coordinator plans to have each Utility Owner address once the project is nearing completion to clean up a bit.
- Mast Arm traffic lights: Sullivan/Summit are either already in or scheduled for installation, but Yanceyville/Summit – on order. To be delivered in February. Yanceyville/Lindsay/Dudley – on order. To be delivered in May. Installation dates not currently available.

The Dunleath Book Club continues to meet monthly in a neighbor's home. All are welcome to join us – whether or not you have had a chance to



read the book! Everyone enjoys the pleasure of conversation and the company of neighbors.

Our March will be on Monday, the 20th, at 7 pm at the home of Vickie Ebright, 695 Percy Street. In anticipation of Spring, we will be discussing Absent in the Spring, by Agatha Christie. Surprisingly, it's not a murder mystery, and Christie originally published it under a pseudonym. It's a thoughtful short tale of a woman, traveling on her way back to England, whose travel is delayed and who therefore has the occasion to stop, take a break from her usual life and reflect on that life. The reader is tempted to ask, "Would I come to similar conclusions about my own life, if I had a similar occasion to stop and look at it?"

Our April meeting will be on Monday the 17th, at 7 pm at the home of Mebane Ham, 675 Percy Street. The book will be *Maus* by Art Spiegelman. It's both the story of Spiegelman's relationship to his father, a holocaust survivor and, in flashbacks, the story of the experiences of Spiegelman's parents in the camps. The book won the Pulitzer Prize. Incidentally, we found out later that Spiegelman actually published the book twice, the earlier edition now sold as Maus I and the later, somewhat expanded and rewritten version, as Maus II. In the spirit of your book club, people are reading whichever of the two they choose.

Please consider joining us. It's always a fun gathering. Feel free to bring a beverage and, if you want, a snack to share, although nothing is required. Nor is it necessary to have read all, or even any, of the book. Just come and enjoy the neighborly company.
